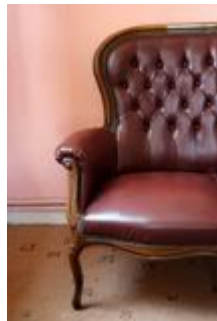

Visual Notations, a show by Sharri LaPierre, is an exploration of color and form. Using solarplate technology LaPierre layers color onto very thin transparent mulberry paper, printing both sides to produce layers of texture and hue.



Her latest work includes botanical subjects as well as figures arising from Greco-Roman, Native American and other mythologies.
